




Face of Fillmore

The home belonging to David and Jeri Robinson is undergoing a major overhaul. A carport has been added on the north, larger windows have been added to the south wall, and the west wall has been replaced by a newly designed one. This house was originally built in 1871 by Moses Bennett. In 1937, Everett and Florence Ashman (the fourth owners of the property) purchased the home on Second West and moved in. Here they raised a family

of six children. The Ashman family never added on to the home, as some did, but rather remodeled and modernized the interior. When Rosie's Grandmother Rackman came to live with the family, the indoor bathroom was added. Jeri Robinson and her husband Don Peterson lived in it since 1989, when she and her first husband Don Peterson bought the home. It is interesting to note that this home has been remodeled several times since it was built 144 years ago.
